

School Culture Survey Community Feedback Analysis



Overview

In 2025, there were 161 respondents. We have approx 670 families at Rostrata, indicating a 25% response rate from families, assuming 1 per family participated. There were 85 individual comments. The survey focused on the 'Relationships' and 'Learning Environment' domains.

Top rated statements

95% Agree/Strongly Agree - Staff and students at this school respect each other

94% Agree/Strongly Agree - I feel well informed about the activities of this school

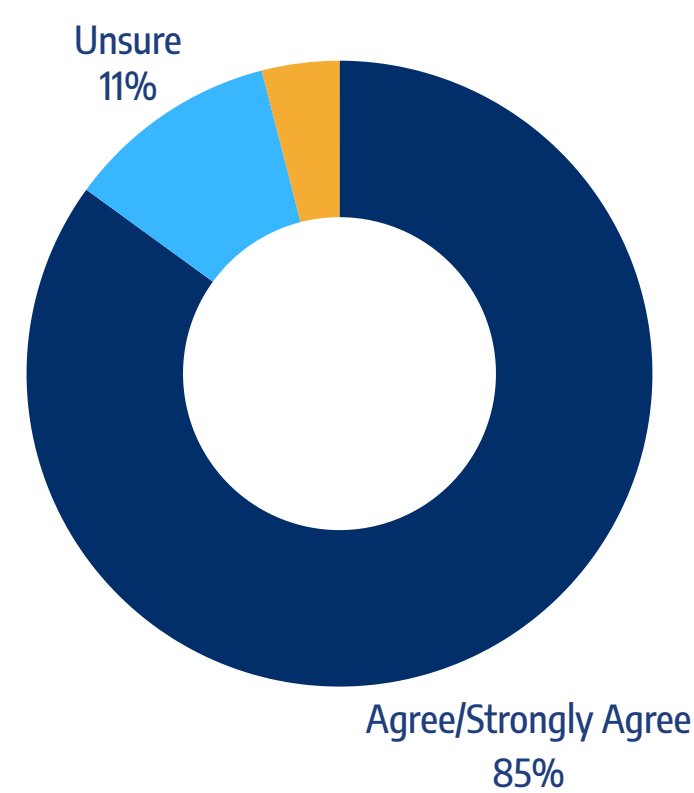
93% Agree/Strongly Agree - Our school creates and sustains a culturally responsive and culturally safe learning environment

93% Agree/Strongly Agree - Teachers at our school are professional, committed and enthusiastic

93% Agree/Strongly Agree - Our school has a culture where mutually respectful relationships are promoted and valued

- Disagree/Strongly disagree

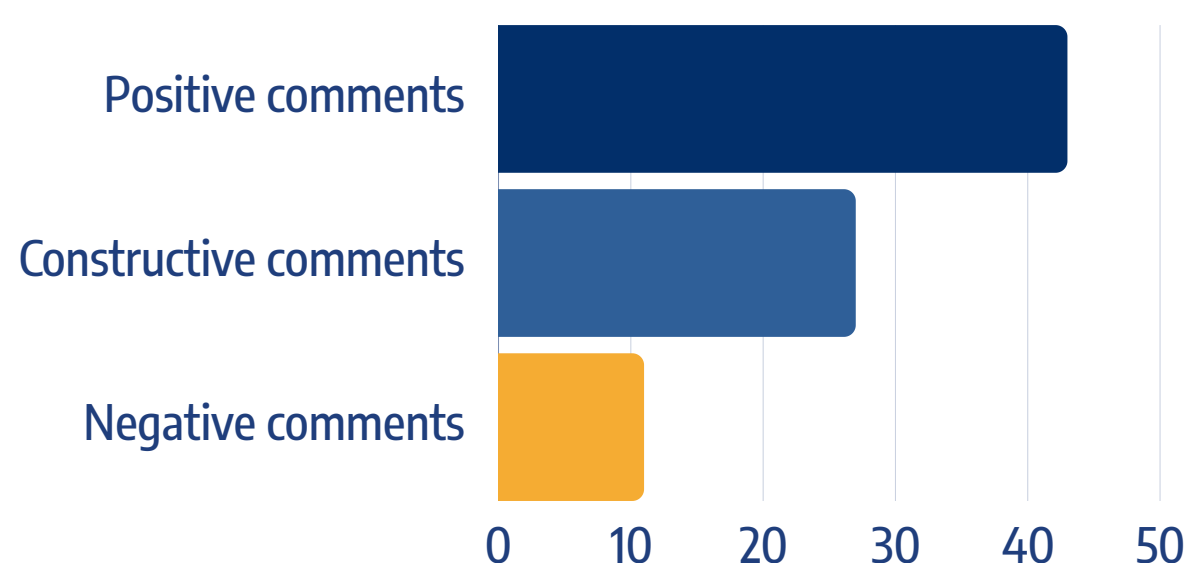


There were 18 positively worded questions in the survey.

Overall there was an average of 85% of respondents who answered 'Agree' or 'Strongly Agree' to all questions.

There was an average of 11% answering 'Unsure' and less than 4% answered 'Disagree' or 'Strongly Disagree'.

Written comment analysis



Negative comments - Key themes

- Small (3) but important, number of families not feeling welcome
- Families (2) indicating their child's individual needs have not been met

Positive comments - Key themes

- Teacher professionalism
- Student enjoyment and engagement
- Inclusive and welcoming culture
- Positive parent-teacher relationships
- Cultural learning and sense of belonging
- Parent engagement opportunities

Constructive comments - Key themes

- Improving awareness of pastoral care
- Seeking consistency on homework expectations
- Need for facilities and resources upgrades
- Further clarity on School Board activities
- Continuing to improve communication
- Strengthening confidence in how we prepare students for the next stage of their education

What we heard

Overall, there is strong evidence of positive engagement and trust in the school. Most written comments were positive or constructive, offering opportunities for refinement. A small number of negative comments were relational and have prompted reflection and review.

Some questions attracted higher "unsure" responses, indicating an opportunity to strengthen communication and visibility so families have greater awareness and understanding of our approach and processes.

What we will do

- An action plan is being developed to address all identified areas for improvement resulting from the survey
- The School Board Community Engagement & Policy sub-committee will oversee and monitor the effectiveness of the action plan
- Ensure families are aware of avenues for addressing individual concerns or issues for the future
- Survey data will be collected again in 2027 to understand the impact of changes made in response to survey data
